Bittersweet (D)	MS-6, MH-15, GR, LF, SWD	Twining woody vine known for showy orange berries in fall & winter landscapes.
BLACK ELDERBERRY(D)(W)	MS-12, MH-12, GR, LP-LF, SM-SWD	Shrub, good for raingardens. Fruit edible to humans, pollinators.
New Jersey Tea (D) (W)	MS-5, MH-3, GR, LF, SWD	Shrubby, upright perennial, white fragrant bloom early summer. Great for pollinators
Red Osier Dogwood (D)	MS-5, MH-20, GM-GR, LS-LP, SM	Pretty shrub w/ bright white berries. Reddish bark, branches in fall/winter.
Catalpa (D)	MS-50-70, MH-50-80, GM-GR, LF, SM-SWD	Ornamental shade tree popular in urban areas & shelterbelts.
BLUEBERRY Highbush(D) (W)	MS-12, MH-12, GR, LS-LP, SM	Prefers very acidic soil. Shrub. Good for wooded or open areas
Eastern Redbud (D)	MS-10, MH-30, GM, LP-LF, SWD	Heralds arrival of Spring with showy pink flowers. Prefers alkaline soils.
Hazelnut (D) (W)	MS-15, MH-15, GM, LF, SM, SWD	Large shrub; provides nuts (food) for humans or wildlife.. Very adaptable
HOPHORNBEAM (D)	MS-30, MH-30, GS, LP-LF, SM-SWD	Prefers acidic soils. Also know as Ironwood, related to birch.
Paw Paw (D) (W)	MS-15, MH-25, GM, LP-LF, SM-SWD	Identified by large tropical looking foliage. Requires part shade.
BLACK GUM (D)	MS-25, MH-60, GM, LP-LF, SM-SWD	Glossy dark green summer foliage & bright fall colors.
Black Walnut (D) (W)	MS-70, MH-20, GR, LP-LF, SM-SWD	Home to wildlife with fruit for wildlife & humans! Related to the Hickory.
Common Lilac (D)	MS-10, MH-20, GM, LP-LF, SM-SWD	Aromatic Spring bloom. A classic choice for around the home.
Ohio Buckeye (D) (W)	MS-30, MH-60, GM, LS-LP, SM	State Tree. Primarily found in understory. Wood is still used in artificial limbs
PERSIMMON (D) (W)	MS-30, MH-50, GS-GM, LP-LF, SM-SWD	Adaptable. Lovely fall colors. Member of Ebony Family.
Red Maple (D)	MS-40, MH-70, GM-GR, LP-LF, SM	Popular shade tree w/ glorious fall colors. Acidic soils
Red Oak (D) (W)	MS-70, MH-60, GR, LP-LF, SM-SWD	Early maturing acorns loved by wildlife. Gorgeous brick-red fall color.
Serviceberry (D) (W)	MS-15, MH-20, GM, LP-LF, SM	Thicket. Adapts to dry soils. Fruit relished by birds and mammals.
Scarlet Oak (D) (W)	MS-50, MH-70, GM-GF, LP-LF, SWD	Can have the best fall color of any oak. Prefers dry acidic soils. Wildlife.
Shagbark Hickory (D) (W)	MS-40, MH-100, GS-GM, LP-LF, SM-SWD	Found in dry uplands. Shaggy bark. Striking winter appearance.
Tulip Poplar (D)	MS-40, MH-80, GR, LF, SM-SWD	Fast growth/narrow canopy ideal for smaller back yards. Showy flowers at maturity.
Arborvitae (D)	MS-10, MH-30, GM, LP-LF, SM	Winter food for deer & other mammals,. Great wildlife shelter. Alkaline soils
Bald Cypress (D)(C)	MS-25, MH-60, GR, LP-LF, SM	Related to Giant Redwoods. Tolerant species found near wetlands
Colorado Blue Spruce (C)	MS-25, MH-50, GS-GM, LF, SM	Residential favorite/lovely blue-silver . Drought resistant once established. Acidic soils.
Douglas Fir (C)	MS- 12-20 , MH- 40-70, GM, LP-LF, SWD	Excellent Christmas tree option. Seeds provide many species food.
Norway Spruce (C)	MS-40, MH-80, GM-GR, LP-LF, SM-SWD	Popular windbreaks. Adaptable to harsh conditions. Prefers acidic soils.
White Pine (C)	MS-40, MH-80, GR, LF, SM	Used for windbreaks and Christmas trees. Popular urban evergreen.
Coneflower (P) (W) All Seasons		Daisy-like flower with raised centers are a magnet for butterflies; seeds in the dried flower heads attract songbirds. 2-4 ft tall, depending on variety. Drought-tolerant. Mixed Colors
Bee Balm (P) (W) MID-SUMMER		Grows 2-4 feet tall. Butterflies, hummingbirds, bees, and other nectar-seeking creatures covet the tubular flowers on the plant's rounded flower heads. Colorful flowers bloom midsummer, tolerates wet soil.
Butterfly Weed (P) (W)		Deer, rabbit and drought resistant. Tolerates poor soil. Showy orange bloom loved by bees and bird pollinators. Late spring to early fall blooms with dead-heading
New England Aster (P) (W) FALL		Prairie, meadow or rain garden plant that grows 3-6 ft tall with purple blooms attractive to butterflies and other pollinators. Blooms late summer to early fall.
Prairie Dropseed -(P) (W)		Grasslike, full sun to partial shade, showy fruit edible for birds. Grows 1-3 ft. tall.
Sedum Autumn Joy (P)(D)(W)		Succulent Unusual foliage color, showy pink flower summer to fall, Deer, rabbit, drought resistant. Attracts bees and other pollinators.
Periwinkle 4" pots (GC)		Viny & grows dense foliage to heights of 6-12 inches. Smothers out most weeds, light blue spring & summer flowers.
