Household Hazardous Waste in the Home

Household hazardous waste should never be thrown in the trash, washed down the drain or poured onto the ground.

- Never leave household hazardous products within the reach of children.
- Buy products that contain less harmful ingredients (see below).
- Reduce by purchasing only the amount needed to do the job.
- Reuse products by donating unused portions of commonly used items, such as paint or fertilizer, to friends or community organizations
- Recycle by taking unwanted products to the Household Hazardous waste events.

Transportation Tips:

- Transport no more than 15 gallons or 125 pounds per trip.
- Don't mix chemicals.
- Place chemicals in sealed containers.
- Transport in trunk and pack to avoid spillage.
- Put plastic underneath all items as a barrier.

- Bon Ami
- Vinegar
- Baking soda
- Washing Soda
- Hydrogen Peroxide
